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1.0 Introduction

Public participation is a constitutional requirement in county governance. Article 1 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 states that sovereign power belongs to the people and in Article 10 (2) (a) and the Fourth Schedule Part 2 (14) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 public participation is stipulated as a function of the County Government. Section 115 (1) and Section 87 of the County Government Act No. 17 of 2012 also provides that citizen participation in county processes as mandatory and principles of citizen participation in Counties. Public participation provides an opportunity for the people to give their inputs and voices to county decisions and this results to sustainable development.

1.1 County Annual Development Plan

The Annual Development Plan 2024/2025 is the second plan developed to implement the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP) III 2023/2027 and is prepared pursuant to section 126 of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) 2012, section 104 of the County Government Act and Article 220 (2) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010. The plan provides a framework that will guide the implementation of the programmes and projects in the FY 2024/2025. It takes into consideration proposals from public engagements by the national government on the Fourth Medium Term Plan 2023/2027, the County Vision 2025 and the County Spatial Plan 2019/2029.

1.2 Objectives of the CADP 2024/25 Public Participation Forums

- To provide feedback to the communities and other stakeholders on approved CIDP III 2023/27 which is the 5-year county planning reference blueprint.
- To provide a platform for the communities to give their inputs/views/memoranda by prioritizing key development issues and interventions for consideration in the ADP 2024/25 and FY 2024/25 budget.
- To document or address any governance issues raised by the communities.

2.1 Public Participation process and methodology

The public participation forums took place on 21st -22nd August, 2023 at 60 subwards of the County. The forums were facilitated in collaboration with department of Finance and Socio-Economic Planning. The forums targeted general public, professionals, opinion leaders, Ward and Subcounty HoDs, organized groups, minority and marginalized groups and special interest groups. The methodologies used during the public participation forums were;

- Lectures,
- Personal views sharing,
- Group discussion,
- Questions and answer,

- Administration of questionnaires
- Submission of memoranda to co.planning@makueni.go.ke.

2.4 Training of public participation facilitators

The Departments organized and facilitated a training of the forum facilitators drawn from Budget, socio-economic planning, public participation and Monitoring and evaluation directorates on 17th August,2023. The participants were trained on the tool, workplan, mode of delivery, data collection and reporting, public participation Dos and Don'ts and expected outputs.

4.0 Challenges, Recommendations and Conclusion

4.1 Challenges

- High community expectations on the county government. The community feels that most of the development proposals they prioritize over the years are not addressed/met.
- Low community attendance to the forums.
- Low participation by youth and people with disability in the public participation forums.
- Alteration of community priority development projects and programs after the budget submission of budget to the County Assembly. This is slowly eroding public confidence on the County Government participatory processes and caused low attendance of the people in such forums.
- Community capacity gaps on participatory planning. Some community members had little understanding on what ADP is.
- Untimely and inadequate community feedback forums on approved budgets.

4.2 Recommendations

- Facilitate Youth and People with Disability thematic participations
- There is need for a strategy to ensure improved and effective youth and PWD participation in the future county planning processes.
- County Executive Committee/County Budget and Economic Forum to safeguard the outcomes public participation processes from alteration by other process stakeholders.
- The department of Devolution to implement both continuous and targeted civic education programmes to sensitize community members on their roles and responsibilities under the devolved system of governance and county planning and budgeting processes
- Strengthening community feedback forums/mechanisms. The CADP participation should be preceded by feedback on approved budget and county annual performance. This will enable communities to prioritize issues and interventions that did not get funding in the previous CADP/budget.
- Timely facilitation of officers undertaking public participation forums.

4.3 Conclusion

For effective and meaningful public participation to be realized the public inputs should be taken into account during decision making processes and governance. The County Government should enhance community feedback mechanism to bridge the gap between community expectation and what is being implemented/has been funded. The community development priorities must be guarded from alteration by other stakeholders. In summary, real public participation helps in recognizing the right of communities to manage their own affairs and to further their development. This culminates in shared prosperity and socio-economic transformation.
