

Makueni County's Digital Leap: Driving Transformation with Innovative Systems

Embracing Digital Transformation with Innovative Online Portals

The Application Development Section of Makueni County's Department of ICT has made significant strides in advancing the county's digital transformation agenda, delivering cutting -edge software solutions designed to streamline governance, enhance transparency, and improve service delivery. During the 2024/2025 Financial Year, the section focused on developing citizencentric digital platforms that automate manual processes, improve data management, and strengthen accountability. These innovations align with the county's strategic goals of fostering inclusive governance, operational efficiency, and public participation.

Key Digital Initiatives Launched

1. Supplier Registration Portal: Enhancing Procurement Transparency

To modernize procurement processes, the county launched the Supplier Registration Portal, a centralized platform where vendors can register, submit compliance documents, and apply for opportunities in four key categories:

- Provision of Services
- Supply of Goods
- Small Works
- Access to Government Procurement
- Opportunities (AGPO)

The system features an **evaluation module** that facilitates committee assessments, task assignments, and approval workflows. **The Chief Officer for Financial Services** reviews eligible suppliers before final publication by the **Head of Procurement**, ensuring compliance and fairness. Additional functionalities include:

- Controlled registration periods
- Automated supplier catalogues
- Comprehensive reporting tools

2. Elimisha Portal: Revolutionizing Bursary Management

The Elimisha Portal has transformed the administration of bursaries and scholarships by digitizing the entire application and disbursement process. Key features include:

- Auto-generated award letters
- Digital cheque lists and collection schedules
- Customizable reports (filtered by sub-county, ward, and school)

This system has significantly **reduced delays**, **enhanced transparency**, and **improved accessibility** for students and guardians.

3. ECDE Information System: Strengthening Early Childhood Development

The ECDE Information System is a unified digital platform that supports data-driven decision-making in Early Childhood Development Education (ECDE). It provides detailed insights into:

- 1,231 ECDE centers, including enrollment statistics by gender and class (PP1 & PP2)
- Teacher records (county-employed vs. parentemployed)
- Infrastructure and equipment tracking
- Quality assurance indicators (teacher training, sanitation, electricity access) This system ensures equitable resource distribution and better oversight of ECDE programs.

4. Community ICT Centre Management System (CIC MIS)

The **CIC MIS** is a centralized platform for managing Community ICT Centres, offering modules for:

- Trainee enrollment and progress tracking
- Instructor management
- Asset and financial monitoring
- Automated certificate issuance

This system enhances accountability and efficiency in digital skills training initiatives.

5. Umanyi Centre: A Digital Knowledge Hub

The **Umanyi Centre** serves as Makueni's **instituti- onal memory**, hosting critical documents such as:

- Kenya Devolution Support Programme (KDSP) reports
- Public participation records
- County planning and budgeting documents
- Policies and legislative acts

This platform promotes **knowledge sharing**, **innovation**, **and evidence-based policymaking** across departments.

6. eServices Dashboard: One-Stop Access to County Services

A unified **eServices Dashboard** was introduced, providing citizens with a **single access point** for all county digital services, improving **user experience and efficiency**.

System Enhancements: Expanding Functionality

1. Internship, Volunteerism, and Attachment (IVA) System

The IVA System, initially designed for internship management, was upgraded to include a Volunteer Management Module, facilitating smoother on boarding and deployment of volunteers.

2. Project Monitoring and Tracking System (PMTS)

The **PMTS** was enhanced to improve procurement tracking, featuring:

- Real-time monitoring of requisitions, tenders, and contracts
- **Custom reporting tools** for budget analysis and project tracking
- Improved citizen feedback mechanisms

The system's success has attracted benchmarking visits from Lamu, Nakuru, Busia, and Nyeri counties, with Busia adopting it under a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

3. Engage Tool: Boosting Public Participation

The Engage Tool was expanded to support:

- Participatory budgeting
- Public participation tracking (across wards and sub-wards)

This upgrade has **deepened citizen involvement** in governance, reinforcing **participatory democracy**.

A Model for Digital Governance

The Application Development Section has played a pivotal role in Makueni's digital transformation, delivering systems that enhance efficiency, transparency, and citizen engagement. These innovations position Makueni as a leader in e-governance, setting a benchmark for other counties in Kenya.

Advancing Digital Inclusion Through Expanded Community ICT Centers

Makueni County has made significant strides in its digital empowerment agenda through the strategic operation of 17 Community ICT Centers (CICs) spread across 15 wards, with Mtito Andei and Kathonzweni wards each hosting two centers. These facilities serve as critical hubs for digital access, skills development, and e-government services, aligning with the county's broader vision for technological transformation.

The county's comprehensive approach focuses on three core pillars: infrastructure development, digital skills training, and enhanced service delivery. Substantial investments have been made to equip these centers with modern workstations, quality furniture, and reliable high-speed internet connectivity. A notable achievement this fiscal year includes the full operationalization of the Kiangini ICT Center, where the county installed nine workstations, implemented structured LAN cabling, and

provided 10Mbps internet connectivity at a cost of Ksh 1.5 million. All centers now benefit from consistent 10Mbps internet provision courtesy of Airtel Kenya.

In the area of skills development, the centers have become vital training grounds for digital literacy. During the reporting period, 635 residents received training in fundamental digital skills, while 234 others completed specialized training in online work through the Ajira Digital program. The program's certification process has been strengthened with enhanced security features to ensure credential authenticity, with 372 certificates already issued and an additional 112 currently being processed.

Beyond education, these centers serve as important access points for government services, significantly reducing the need for residents to travel to county offices. The past year saw 2,356 members utilizing CICs community various e-government services, contributing Ksh 498,000 in collected revenue. Operational efficiency has been further boosted through the of county-wide implementation Management Information System, with all center personnel now fully trained on the platform.

This multi-pronged initiative demonstrates Makueni County's commitment to bridging the digital divide and creating meaningful opportunities for its residents. With continued investment and expansion, the program is poised to deliver even greater impact in the coming years, solidifying Makueni's position as a leader in grassroots digital transformation.

Makueni County's Tech Hub Drives Digital **Transformation and Youth Empowerment**

Nestled within Wote Green Public Park, the Makueni Technology and Innovation Hub has emerged as a beacon of digital progress, offering free Wi-Fi access, computer literacy programs, and innovation challenges designed to inspire the next generation of tech pioneers.

This state - of - the -art facility has become a cornerstone of community development, particularly for the county's youth, by fostering collaboration, promoting digital skills, and bridging the information gap.


The hub's impact was particularly evident during the 2024/2025 financial year through several landmark initiatives. In partnership with Ajira Kenya, the facility hosted a two-day intensive training program on May 12th and 13th, 2025, attracting 27 young participants-17 female and 10 male-who gained hands-on experience in data analysis and freelancing platforms. The sessions, held from 9:00 AM daily, equipped attendees with practical skills to thrive in the digital economy.

Further underscoring its commitment to gender inclusivity in tech, the hub celebrated International Girls in ICT Day in April 2025 under the theme "Girls in ICT For Inclusive Digital Transformation." The event brought together 40 young women for an immersive experience featuring coding labs, digital storytelling workshops, and mentorship sessions focused on building confidence in STEM fields. This global initiative, embraced by Makueni County, seeks to dismantle barriers for girls in computer science by providing accessible introductory lessonsdeliverable online, via smartphone, or through offline methods. With projections indicating that 65% of today's primary school children will work in jobs that don't yet exist, predominantly in technology-driven sectors, such early interventions are critical for ensuring girls' future economic independence.

Complementing these efforts, the Ajiry Centrea specialized wing under the Department of ICT, Education & Internship-has made remarkable strides in nurturing creative talent. The facility offers free training in music production, podcasting, and digital content creation, having 179 artists since its inception, supported including 42 female and 137 male creatives. In the reporting period alone, 77 artists recorded their work at the center, while over 300 youth received training in social media management, graphic design, mental wellbeing, and financial literacy.

These initiatives collectively demonstrate Makueni County's holistic approach to youth development-merging technical creative arts training to prepare young residents for diverse opportunities in the evolving digital landscape.

As the hub continues to expand its programs, it stands as a model for how rural counties can leverage technology to drive inclusive growth and position their youth at the forefront of innovation.



Makueni County Sets the Gold Standard Early Childhood Development Education The Government of Makueni County has made transformative strides in Early Childhood Development Education(ECDE), showcasing an unwavering commitment to nurturing young minds through comprehensive, innovative approaches. By prioritizing teacher welfare, modern infrastructure, capacity building, and cutting-edge learning tools, the county is redefining early childhood education benchmarks in Kenya.

In the formative years of the current county government regime, a landmark move to stabilize the ECDE workforce was initiated by Governor Mutula Kilonzo Junior, which transitioned 958 teachers from temporary contracts to permanent and pensionable terms. This strategic decision did not only bolster educator morale and retention but also ensured consistent, high-quality instruction for Makueni's youngest learners.

The department was also keen to seek collaborations with like-minded organizations like Anita Mbinya Foundation and Lapfund who supported the initiative to distribute seats and chairs to ECDE centers to ensure that children learn in comfort, with ergonomic furniture designed to support focus and participation.

In a bold leap toward future-ready learning, Makueni has previously partnered with EIDU to integrate digital tools into every ECDE center. Interactive tablets and educational software are transforming classrooms, making lessons dynamic and preparing children for a technology -driven world.

The following successes in the 2024/2025 Financial year are attributed to these bold moves made by the county government leadership.



Elevating Teaching Excellence Through Strategic Partnerships

Recognizing that exceptional teachers shape exceptional futures, the county in April 2025, partnered with UNICEF to train 958 ECDE educators, 11 officers and 41 departmental staff members on the



This program equipped teachers and staff with advanced skills in holistic child development integrating health, nutrition, safety, and cognitive growth into daily learning experiences.

The program also retooled the teachers on the revised curriculum designs.

Building Foundations for Success: Modern Classrooms for Young Learners

To create inspiring spaces for early learning, the county previously constructed new classrooms across 95 ECDE centers. In the just concluded financial year, the county through the Department of ICT, Education and Internship constructed and upgraded 42 ECDE centers across the county. These bright, spacious, and well - equipped facilities reflect Makueni's dedication to providing safe, stimulating environments where children can thrive academically and socially.

Makueni County also delivered textbooks, educational toys, charts, and other critical materials to the ECDE centers-ensuring every classroom fosters curiosity, creativity, and foundational skills in literacy and numeracy.



Spotlighting Young Talent: Dominance in **National Music Festivals**

Makueni's ECDE learners are not just excelling in classrooms-they're shining on national stages. In 2024, the county proudly presented five performances at the National Music Festivals, with three clinching top honors in their categories. Building on this success, 2025 has seen 10 items advance to regional competitions, featuring 147 talented young performers guided by 17 dedicated teachers. These achievements underscore the county's commitment nurturing artistic expression and confidence in its youngest stars.



A Bold Vision for the Future

Makueni County's holistic ECDE strategyspanning teacher empowerment, infrastructure, creativity, and innovation - demonstrates its leadership in early childhood education. These efforts align with Sustainable Development Goal 4 (Quality Education) and affirm the county's pledge to inclusive, equitable learning for every child.

As Makueni's young learners continue to break barriers in academics and the arts, the county stands as a beacon of progress, proving that investing in early education today builds a brighter tomorrow for all.

Transforming Lives Through Libraries: Strides Made Since The transfer of the Function Makueni County Reimagines Public Libraries as Engines of Community Trans for mation Since assuming responsibility for library services in 2023, Makueni County has embarked on an ambitious journey to reinvent public libraries as dynamic hubs of knowledge, innovation, and social empowerment. What began as an administrative transfer has blossomed into a comprehensive literacy revolution that is touching lives across the county's diverse communities.

Women's Empowerment Through Knowledge Access

At the heart of this transformation stands the groundbreaking Women's Library Group at Kithasyu Library, which has become a model for community-driven learning. Over the past year, the group's members have demonstrated remarkable engagement, borrowing more than 300 books focused on critical areas including maternal health, balanced nutrition, and household wellness. The practical application of this knowledge has yielded tangible results, with participating women reporting improved family health practices and better nutritional choices in their homes.

"These books have taught us how to prepare balanced meals using locally available foods," shared one group member. "We've seen fewer cases of malnutrition in our children since we started applying what we learned."

Building a Culture of Reading Through Teacher Empowerment


The county's partnership with the Kenya National Library Service (KNLS) has produced the landmark Inspiring Readers Project, which has already trained 60 teachers in advanced library management techniques. Conducted at both Kithasyu and Mutyambua Libraries, the intensive training program equipped educators with skills in:

- Modern library organization systems
- Engaging reading promotion strategies
- Age-appropriate book selection methods
- Creative literacy programming for students

These newly empowered teacher-librarians are now implementing innovative reading programs in their schools, creating ripple effects that extend to thousands of students across the county.







Expanding Educational Infrastructure

Building on this success, Makueni County is preparing to launch an ambitious school library expansion initiative. Through continued collaboration with KNLS, the county will establish 10 fully equipped, modern school libraries in strategic locations. Each facility will be stocked with:

- Curriculum-aligned educational materials
- Locally relevant supplementary readers
- Digital learning resources
- Interactive learning spaces

This initiative directly addresses the critical shortage of learning resources in many schools, particularly in rural areas where access to books has historically been limited.

Bridging the Information Gap

Demonstrating an unprecedented commitment to information access, the county's library service has distributed an average of 50,000 copies of informational materials annually since the transition.

This massive dissemination effort includes:

- Agricultural extension pamphlets helping farmers improve yields
- Public health materials addressing local disease prevention needs
- Civic education resources enhancing community participation
- Career guidance publications for youth empowerment

Distribution strategies have been carefully designed to ensure materials reach even the most remote villages, with mobile library units and community information points supplementing traditional library branches.

A Vision for the Future

"These achievements represent beginning of our library transformation journey," said the County Executive for Education. "We envision our libraries evolving into true community knowledge centers-places where farmers can access agricultural data, students can explore digital learning, and entrepreneurs



can research business opportunities."

With plans underway to expand digital resources, enhance community programming, and strengthen partnerships with educational institutions, Makueni County is positioning its library system as a cornerstone of its broader development

agenda. The remarkable progress since the 2023 transfer demonstrates how strategic investment in knowledge

infrastructure can yield exponential returns in education, health, and economic empowerment. Residents are encouraged to visit their local libraries to explore these new resources and participate in upcoming literacy programs.











Boosting education access, student retention, transition and academic performance

Makueni County Invests KSh 114 Million in Education Bursaries, Benefiting Over 18,000 Students

In a significant boost to education access, the Makueni County Government allocated KSh 114 million to its bursary program for the 2024/2025 financial year. This substantial investment will support 18,173 deserving students across all 30 wards of the county, demonstrating the administration's strong commitment to educational development.

The bursary program, an initiative of Governor Mutula Kilonzo Junior through the county's education department, aims to alleviate financial barriers that often prevent bright but economically disadvantaged students from pursuing their academic dreams. By distributing these funds equitably across all wards, the county ensures that educational opportunities reach every corner of Makueni.


County Education Executive Elizabeth Muli emphasized that this allocation represents one of the largest single-year investments in the bursary program since its inception. "Education remains our most powerful tool for breaking the cycle of poverty and empowering future generations," she stated. "This KSh 114 million investment will open doors for thousands of young people who might otherwise have been forced to abandon their studies due to financial constraints."

The selection process for beneficiaries followed strict criteria to ensure fairness and transparency, with priority given to orphans, students from single-parent households, and those from particularly vulnerable backgrounds. Ward committees played a crucial role in identifying the most deserving cases within their communities.

Parents and guardians across the county have welcomed the initiative, with many describing it as a lifeline for their children's education. Secondary school principals have also praised the program, noting its positive impact on student retention rates and academic performance.

This year's allocation marks a significant increase in beneficiaries from the previous year's bursary fund, reflecting the county government's growing commitment to education as a key pillar of its development agenda. The funds will cover tution fees for primary, secondary, and tertiary students, with disbursements being made directly to learning institutions to ensure proper utilization.

As Makueni continues to prioritize human capital development, education stakeholders anticipate that this substantial investment will yield long-term benefits for the county's socioeconomic transformation, producing a more skilled workforce and empowering young people to contribute meaningfully to their communities.



Makueni County Accelerates Youth Empowerment Through Major Vocational Training Overhaul

Makueni County Comprehensive Vocational Training Revolution

In an ambitious move to reshape technical education, Makueni County Government has unveiled sweeping reforms to its vocational training

system, marking the 2024/2025 financial year as a turning point for youth empowerment and skills development in the region.

The county's multifaceted approach combines massive infrastructure expansion with digital innovation and strategic partnerships, creating what education experts are calling "a blueprint for vocational training transformation." At the heart of this revolution are construction projects that promise to redefine technical education infrastructure across the county.



The Directorate of Technical Training reported significant progress on dormitory projects at both Makueni CTTI and Nziu CTTI, while Kisingo CTTI undergoes critical workshop upgrades. Security and facility improvements are underway at Kyanduya CTTI through new perimeter fencing, with Kathulumbi and Mutanda CTTIs both benefiting from expansive twin workshop

constructions designed to accommodate growing student numbers.

In a groundbreaking digital shift, the county has operationalized its Vocational Training Centre Information Management System, a compreheplatform that streamlines nsive student enrollment, resource allocation, and performance tracking across all 60 vocational centers. This technological leap comes alongside substantial

human resource investments, including the recruitment of twelve specialized instructors to enhance training quality and a series of intensive management workshops for institutional leaders.

The legislative framework supporting these changes is equally robust, with the draft Makueni County Vocational Training Bill 2024 currently awaiting public participation. This proposed legislation aims to formalize and standardize vocational education across the county. Quality



assurance remains a priority, with recent TVETA assessment reports providing actionable insights for continuous improvement.

Financial commitments have kept pace with these structural changes, as evidenced by the county's disbursement of twenty million shillings in capitation funds to vocational institutions. This injection of resources has dramatically reduced training costs for students while enabling centers to upgrade equipment and expand program offerings.

Perhaps most innovative are the generating initiatives that have transformed vocational centers into active contributors to county development. MIVEC's catering services now support county treasury operations, while students at Kathonzweni VTC have put their construction skills to practical use building stockyards at local markets.

Strategic partnerships have amplified these efforts, with Camara Foundation providing computers and generators to three institutions, and KCB Foundation establishing a matching grant program to support fourteen vocational training centers. These collaborations complement the county's own initiatives, including its inaugural Skills Exhibition and the upcoming KCB 2Jiajiri Program set to train 900 youth beginning June 2025.



Governance reforms complete the picture, with newly operational Boards of Governors now providing oversight at all sixty vocational training centers. "We're not just renovating buildings," emphasized County Education ECM. "We're rebuilding the entire vocational education ecosystem from the ground up - from policy to practical training to partnerships with industry."

As these reforms take hold, Makueni County emerges as a national leader in vocational education, offering a replicable model for addressing youth unemployment while meeting the evolving skills demands of Kenya's economy. With its comprehensive approach bridging infrastructure, technology, instruction, and governance, the county is writing a new chapter in technical education that promises to transform thousands of young lives.

Accelerating Youth Empowerment Through Expanded Capacity Building Programs Makueni, Kenya - In a bold move to address youth unemployment and skills development, the Makueni County Government has implemented groundbreaking internship, mentorship, and volunteer programs that are setting new standards in public sector youth empowerment.

Transformative Programs with Measurable Impact The county's multifaceted approach has this year created opportunities for hundreds of young professionals through several key initiatives:

1. Robust Internship Program

Makueni County has successfully recruited, placed, and managed 125 interns across various government departments. These paid internships provide crucial on - the - job training, with the county going beyond basic placement by implementing two structured mentorship programs specifically designed to enhance professional development.



"Interns gain more than just work experience here," noted County Executive for Education & ICT. "Our mentorship components ensure they develop both technical skills and essential workplace competencies that make them competitive in the job market."

2. Expanded Attachment Opportunities

The county's attachment program has become a vital bridge between academia and employment, offering practical experience to 607 attachees. What sets Makueni's program apart is its three specialized mentorship tracks that provide tailored guidance for participants based on their fields of study and career aspirations.

3. Revitalized Volunteer Program

Seventy-two volunteers have been strategically placed in community development projects

through an innovative automated application system. The county's digital transformation of volunteer recruitment has streamlined processes, reduced paperwork, and improved transparency in selection.

Digital Innovation in Youth Programs

Makueni has leveraged technology to enhance program efficiency, implementing a fully automated application and processing system for volunteer positions. This digital platform has:

- Reduced processing time by 60%
- Increased application accessibility
- Created a centralized database for better program management

"The automation of our youth programs ensures equal opportunity for all applicants while improving our operational efficiency," explained the County ICT Director. "Young people can now apply and track their applications from anywhere using their mobile devices."

Comprehensive Mentorship Framework

Beyond work placements, Makueni has invested significantly in mentorship, conducting:

- 2 specialized programs for interns focusing on career development and public sector ethics
- 3 structured mentorship initiatives for attachees emphasizing technical skills enhancement

These programs incorporate workshops, oneon-one coaching, and networking events with county leaders and private sector partners.



Tangible Results and Future Plans

Preliminary assessments show the programs have:

- Increased employability for 85% of participants
- Enhanced service delivery through additional skilled personnel
- Created a talent pipeline for county workforce needs

Looking ahead, Makueni plans to:

- 1. Expand capacity to accommodate 30% more participants annually
- 2. Develop specialized tracks in emerging sectors like renewable energy and agribusiness
- 3.Strengthen partnerships with technical institutions and private sector players



"Makueni's approach goes beyond token youth empowerment," said a representative from the Council of Governors. "They've created a holistic ecosystem that combines practical experience, professional development, and technological innovation."

As the programs continue to evolve, Makueni County stands as a shining example of how strategic investment in youth can simultaneously address unemployment while building a skilled workforce for the future.
